Saving gorillas in the mist

September 2003.

Dear Mrs. Crossland,

Thank you so much for making me so welcome at the Spire USA meeting on Monday 8th September, and thanks also to your members for their generous donations to the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund, with my fee and the donations from the tin I was today able to bank a total of £75.77p into the funds account, every penny that your members gave goes into the fund as I never take any money for expenses.

Money goes a very long way in Africa: £10.00 would buy enough saplings to reforest one acre of desecrated parkland; £25.00 would pay for a starter kit of tools and seeds so that a whole family could live sustainable outside the parks boundaries; £45.00 would enable us to recruit, train, and equip one anti-poaching ranger. So you can see that the money your members have given will make quite a difference to the people and gorillas in central Africa. Please feel free to pass my contact details on to any other clubs etc. that may be interested in hearing about "Gorillas in the midst of conflict", thanks again.
